Thanks for forwarding Dan Simpson's essay (see below). I agree with much Dan has to say.

With a limit of 1,000 words, much cannot be addressed e.g. is there a Trojan Horse at work here? It has been estimated that 70% of the "refugees" are males between the

1. Is it possible that some of these Refugees are imbedded terrorists?
2. Why are the wealthy Arab states refusing to absorb some of the refugees?

If we had a Secretary of State with some Imagination, he might suggest that Saudi Arabia, Emirates, Kuwait, et al each pledge \$5billion/year for 5 years; the Europeans could likewise pledge a total of \$5billion (cheaper than 1,000,000 refugees on the dole) and the U.S. could also pony up \$5billion a year for five years.

With \$25billion+/year the fund could purchase 10,000 hectares (circa 25,000 acres) from, say, Jordan for \$10billion and build infrastructure, sewers, public water, roads, apartment buildings, desalinization plants, etc.

Then:

- a) Plant a cordon of UN Peace Keepers around the perimeter of this New Land, for security.
- b) Encourage companies (textiles, etc.) to locate there, lured by safe conditions, available labor and throw in a "Tax Haven" component.
- c) Encourage (for a period of time) UN countries to accept goods from this area with no taxes, tariffs, etc.

This would enable Muslims to relocate in a Muslim environment and to more easily return to their home lands, when appropriate; at the same time mitigating the crises facing countries, which are being forced to accept these (non-vetted) refugees.
